BETCHWORTH PARISH COUNCIL

MINUTES of the MEETING of the BETCHWORTH PARISH COUNCIL held on MONDAY 7th July 2014, at 8pm in the Hamilton Room.

Present: Councillors Hardy, Savill, Stow, Wilson, Higgins, Docwra the Footpaths Officer, District Councillor Potter and the Clerk. PCSO Dave Sadler was present for part of the meeting. Peter Charman, agent for Moores Open Storage and 4 local residents were also present for part of the meeting.

1. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE.

(90) Apologies were received from Councillor Taylor and County Councillor Clack

2. MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING.

(91) The minutes of the meeting held on 2nd June were approved and signed by the Chairman as a true and correct record.

3. MATTERS ARISING

(92) Ian Docwra signed the Acceptance of Office form, witnessed by the Clerk.

4. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST.

(93) None

5. CRIME AND ORDER.

(94) There was 1 reported crime since June 3rd: a watch had been stolen from Hartsfield Manor. PCSO Dave Sadler also reported that 2 individuals had been arrested in Betchworth for an offence committed in Dorking and that those responsible for setting fires in Surrey sports pavilions had been apprehended.

6. OPEN FORUM.

- (95) 3 representatives from the Barley Mow Residents Association and Peter Charman updated Council on how work is progressing. Generally, the Barley Mow residents are happy with the operation of the site, just one small niggle over the closure of the old entrance on Old Road. Peter Charman explained that Mole Valley District Council require a more permanent solution to the closure of the old entrance rather than a locked gate. An agreement in writing for a plan and planting scheme is to be submitted to MVDC. Peter Charman will consult with the Barley Mow Residents Associate to find a solution that is acceptable to all. Councillor Higgins requested that all planting be native species. Councillor Docwra pointed out that there are still frequent breaches of operating hours; however, the residents of Barley Mow Court, which is actually adjacent to the yard, were surprised to hear this as they are no longer being disturbed by noise outside operating hours.
- (96) Council thanked Peter Charman and Moores Open Storage for their intention to consider a dark, non-reflective replacement for the waterproof surround when it requires renewal.

(97) The meeting order was changed from the agenda to allow the Footpaths Officer to leave the meeting.

7. TRANSPORT, HIGHWAYS AND FOOTPATHS. Footpath Officer's Report.

- (98) Many footpaths are very overgrown. Surprised, but thankful, that SCC Highways have performed a second cut in 6 weeks. Lots of footpaths have been cleared.
- (99) On June 23rd a fly-tipping nuisance was reported to MVDC. The matter was re-reported on June 27th by the Footpaths Officer and by another resident, it was cleared the following day.
- (100) A limited litter sweep was performed. It was reported that there were a large number of beer cans and high-energy drink cans.
- (101) Footpath by old cattle barn believed to have been damaged by contractions repairing nearby road has been partially made good with planings but the second half still requires attention.
- (102) Bus Shelter near A25 John Foreman had obtained a quotation to restore fully the shelter (£4216 with cedar roof shingles, £3345 with featheredge instead of shingles). However, further inspection of the shelter indicated that it is structurally sound and only the roof requires immediate attention. It was agreed that another quotation be sought for making the shelter watertight.
- (103) Bus Shelter opposite post office John Foreman was thanked for his work on recovering the roof of this shelter.
- (104) Fingerpost at top of The Street. John Foreman was thanked for his efforts on restoring the post and lettering. Council was pleased that the 'notice posters' are heeding the request not to use staples/nails on this post.
- (105) Parr's Corner Signage Council voted to accept the quotation of £477.60 (including £79.60 VAT) for a 10' x 5" x 5" post. The lettering was agreed as follows: on the right-hand finger: Village Store, Brockham; on the left-hand finger: Betchworth Church, Leigh; on the finger at right-angle: Village Hall, Pebblehill. Betchworth to be routed and painted on the face of the post. Delivery and installation not included in quote.
- (106) Wet Spot Station Road junction with A25. SCC Highways and Clerk have been monitoring situation, after recent heavy rain and flooding in this area, SCC Highways have agreed to add this location to the list for the ad hoc jetter.
- (107) School Parking. No firm conclusion from the Walled Garden residents meeting on June 16th, another meeting scheduled for next week. However, the parking/drop-off system is working well with just a few teething problems. It is anticipated that there will be some future funding requests. It was agreed to send a letter of thanks to the Estate from the Parish Council and District Cllr Potter.
- (108) Resurfacing of church path. This is thought to be a designated town path and, as such, the responsibility of SCC Highways and thus a potential candidate for an SCC Highways localism project. Bernard Hawkins to be asked for a more specific proposal.

- (109) School Path Hedges are very overgrown and there have been several complaints. RSPB website states that hedges may be cut in August. Letter to home owners and housing association.
- (110) It was reported that at the junction of Kiln Lane and Old Reigate Road the directional signs are obscured by overgrown vegetation. Matter to be reported to SCC Highways

10. AMENITIES

- (127) Allotments. Clerk reported that Councillor Taylor had been let down with the hire of a skip to remove the last of the rubbish, new skip to be hired as soon as possible.
- (128) Allotments. The majority of the allotment holders voted in favour of compost bins and beehives for the cleared area, no specific objections. It was agreed that there is room for 6 compost bins. Reigate beekeepers have been contacted for advice through their website, awaiting a response.
- (129) Burial Ground. It was noted that there is a sign on the gates at either end of the burial ground requesting dogs be leashed and a further sign on the post next to the burial ground of 'No Dogs'. It was agreed that the 'No Dogs' sign be replaced with a more specific 'No Dogs in Burial Ground' sign.
- (130) Burial Ground. There are no dog waste bins. Clerk to investigate how to obtain a bin and arrange emptying.
- (131) Burial Ground. It was agreed the wooden post by the burial ground with notice of charges needs replacing.
- (132) Burial Ground Jubilee Pavilion. It was noted that there had been an onsite project meeting with Councillor Wilson, the Footpath Officer, Rick Norman and Rupert Gibbs. It is anticipated that groundworks will start within the next week. It was agreed that brick pavers up to the value of £1,000 be used for the floor, pavers to be approved by Council. County Cllr Clack to be updated when groundworks are complete and date is known for erection of pavilion.
- (133) Goulburn Green water supply. Council approved the purchase of a curb key and two brass keys.
- (134) Burial Ground. The Walled Garden residents are repairing the wall and have requested that the ivy growing on the burial ground side of the wall be removed. Clerk to obtain quote from Dave Ellot.
- (135) Burial Ground water Supply. It was thought that the newly-repaired pipe is probably robust and that the recent heavy machinery in the area might have contributed to the leak. It was agreed to await another leak before replacing the water supply to the burial ground
- (136) Burial Ground water leak. Thank you to John Foreman and to Trevor Hurman for repairing leak.
- (137) Burial Ground. Council voted not to waive non-resident burial ground charges for a long-term resident (35 years and former District Cllr) now resident in Leigh but still owns land in Betchworth.
- (138) Burial Ground Memorial for Approval Light grey granite, inscription: 'SEALE in our hearts loved and cherished DAVID 28.9.1910 7.9.1990 BEATRICE MABEL (MAY) 9.10.1907 9.6.1993 PATRICIA EILEEN (PAT) 11.8.1933 3.5.2013' was approved provided the stone is not polished. *Post meeting note: Sherlock & Sons confirmed stone is of a honed finish.*
