BETCHWORTH PARISH COUNCIL

MINUTES of the MEETING of the BETCHWORTH PARISH COUNCIL held on MONDAY 1

MARCH 2021, held remotely via Zoom online and dial-in platform. The meeting was recorded for the purpose of minute-taking.

Present: Cllrs Hardy (Chair), Winter, Rogers, Higgins, Edwards Wilson, Randall and Clerk (Marion Hallett), County Councillor Clack attended part of the meeting along with District Councillors Budd. The Burialground Caretaker and two members of public also attended part of the meeting.

1. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE.

(399) Apologies were received from District Councillor Potter.(400) Councillor Hardy welcomed the two members of public to the meeting.

2. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST.

(401) No declarations were received.

3. MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING.

(402) The minutes of the meeting held on 1 February 2021 were approved and signed by Councillor Hardy as a true and correct record.

4. COMMUNITY POLICE REPORT.

(403) Councillors reviewed the police report received which covered the month of February 2021.

5. OPEN FORUM.

(404) Councillors discussed planning application MO/2020/2376 outlined in Agenda item 7 due to the applicant being present. Councillors were satisfied that no comment was required to be submitted to MVDC. Councillor Hardy thanked the member of public for attending.

(405) 8.15pm The member of public left the meeting.

6. TRANSPORT HIGHWAYS AND FOOTPATHS.

(406) Clerk displayed a map provided by Cllr Winter identifying locations for proposed kissing gates to replace stiles. Cllr Winter confirmed that the Estate had approved these locations at a meeting between Estate Management and the Parish Council in February. The map contained two stiles not on Estate land which require further investigation prior to purchase. Cllr Winter confirmed that the Estate will manage installation of two gates. SCC to provide volunteers for installation of remainder. Awaiting exact amount of Financial contribution from SCC, (circa. £2k) the remainder to be funded from the COVID grant received earlier in the year.

(407) Cllr Winter provided an update following meeting with the Estate and general condition of footpaths Parish Council and Estate to continue to work together to identify issues and remedy where possible, and offer support with the Stewardship programme if required.

(408) Cllr Winter also informed those present of dog poo bin requests in three locations submitted to MVDC, to support the Estate in its efforts to reduce the number of cattle killed after contracting Neospora from dog excrement.

(409) Cllr Winter confirmed completion of resurfacing and widening of FP90 (Wheeler's Lane), coordinated with SCC/Brockham PC and passed thanks to Cllr Budd. Cllr Budd highlighted the need for additional hard surface under the gate.

(410) Cllr Randall provided a brief update following a positive Highways meeting earlier in the month including flooding and refurbishment of Betchworth Bridge (outstanding from historic flood damage). He circulated a document containing information on proposed Gateways and associated costs. Cllr Randall proposed two speed survey locations be carried out, one on Snower Hill, one on Old Reigate Road, at £180+VAT, and roundels on Old Reigate Road at speed	GR
restriction sign. (411) A member of public highlighted the excessive speeding up Pebble Hill Road and asked whether a speed camera could be considered. Councillors confirmed that the low level of response from SCC has been an issue for many years despite regular requests by Betchworth PC to provide additional restrictions along the road.	
(412) Cllr Winter confirmed he is preparing the PC submission on Night Flight consultation with Cllr Wilson for submission in the week. He also confirmed the Gatwick Route 4 change which has taken place this week (flight path moved 1km north this week).	
(413) Following cleaning of blocked drain outside More Place on Wonham Lane, Cllr Budd passed a camera down the drain to investigate ongoing blockage problem – drain still blocked. Clerk to request further jetting of pipe to fully understand the problem however further blocking still likely due to the existing pipe's ineffectiveness. Further remedial works required and discussion with SCC necessary to resolve the issue.	Clerk/SB

(417) Councillor Wilson updated those present on a meeting between representatives of Burialground Plot Holders who disputed the Council's decision to enforce burialground rules to level and re-turf grave gardens. Councillor Wilson and the Burialground Caretaker to liaise with the grounds maintenance contractor to enable returfing to commence with graves where no objections have been made, and to enable families to carry out returfing themselves where requested. (424) Cllr Edwards checked the play equipment on 6/2, 12/2 and 27/2. Play equipment remains in good condition and fit for purpose. (425) Cllr Hardy asked Cllr Edwards for an update following discussions with the Betchworth Estate on the demand for parking at the lower end Common Field. Councillors discussed whether to offer support for the proposal of installation of surfacing to enable year-round parking predominantly for the school, also offering parking for village shop and church overflow, due to the field's current inaccessibility in the winter and historic complaints of cars parking in the private road from Walled Garden residents. Doubt was raised as to whether upgrading the parking facility would change existing parking habits and questioned whether an offering of additional parking would fit with the village's 'Greener Betchworth' credentials, however it was noted that off-road designated parking close to the school would be an asset to offer year-round safer access for children. Clerk to respond to Estate with comments, noting support from the Parish Council, School and Church would all be required should they wish to proceed. Clerk to provide feedback to Estate.	Clerk
 (426) Clerk displayed a map requesting three additional dog poo bins to be placed at entrances to the Chimney Pots walk, which would enable bins at all entrance points to the Chimney Pots walk.  9. COMMUNITY. (428) Cllr Edwards provided an update on the Bird Box and rewilding project confirming installation of 95 bird boxes in situ around the village. 3 reserved for The Firs development. Bird mapping also in progress. Bug hotels have been placed in the nursery and on the wall adjacent to the Hamilton Room. Councillors thanked Cllrs Edwards and Higgins for their efforts. (429) Cllr Higgins updated those present on the rewilding project confirming a 	
strip of 3m wide to be left unmown on Goulburn Green to 'see what happens' with an introduction of seeds and of plug plants. Plants to be purchase by member of the public and refunded by the Parish Council. (430) A combined budget of £400 was approved for the purchase of plug plants	HE/MH
and seeds for rewilding in Goulburn Green and the Burialground. These will be planted and watered by volunteers coordinated by a member of the Greener Betchworth 'Flora' group.
